# **RULES**

All Exhibits to be brought to the Show Marquee between 8 and 10am on the day of the Show. Prizes will be presented on the day. No person will take more than one prize in any class.

## **Rules in keeping with Royal Horticultural Society**

If in the Judge's opinion no entry in a class is worthy, no prize will be awarded.

### **The judge's decision is final.**

All vegetables, fruit and garden produce to be grown by the person by whom they are exhibited. All vegetables are to be washed and trimmed, except onions which should be washed but shown with roots and tops. Flowers for Floral Art A43-45 and AO43-45 may be purchased. Children's flowers to be arranged in the tent on the morning of the Show up to 10am. All domestic entries to be home made.

All handicrafts are to have been completed within the last twelve months.

All entries are to be clearly marked with the Class number.

Pot plants must be in the possession of the competitor for two months prior to the day of the show

Potatoes, Tomatoes and Fruit to be shown on white plates

Flowers are to be placed in water.

Classes A1 to A59 and C1 to C14 are for Kingsteignton residents only. Classes preceded by the letter 'O' are Open classes.

Several Cups will be awarded. In the event of ties the trophy will be shared over the period of one year.

The town council is not responsible for loss or damage to any exhibit.

**All Cups and trophies are perpetual.**
